FYI, the State Inspector General is not a viable option. The IG does not have jurisdiction over the Legislature.

If we want to do a criminal referral, we could send it to a DA (Soares or Morgenthau are the most likely candidates).

The AG does not have plenary criminal authority over this issue, but could do a civil investigation. HOWEVER, the Governor has the ability under Executive Law Section 63 to GRANT the AG criminal authority over the matter.

I'm not convinced that we want to have the Governor take the affirmative step of granting criminal authority to the AG over this.

Also, I'm not sure that we need to do anything. My guess is that by tomorrow, either Soares or Morgenthau or the Southern District will respond to the press by saying that they are going to look into this, and we can send them whatever documents we have (although the documents already are on the TU website).


I think we should talk about this before doing anything.
